



Introduction

When we were booking our flights to Delhi and Guwahati, we had chosen 3 May 2024 for departure to Delhi with a connecting flight to Guwahati. A few weeks before departure we were informed that our flight to Delhi was cancelled, but we could take a flight one day earlier, meaning that we had a day in Delhi. We thought to hire a guide for the day and go birding in the vicinity of Delhi, Sultanpur and Chandu, with our main objective being the local Sind Sparrow. As a guide we chose CB Singh, an excellent guide. His contact details are cbsing at cbti.co.in.

Itinerary

- **2 May** We took the KLM 871 flight of 14:10 from **Amsterdam** to **New Delhi.** Flight departed in time and nothing worth to mention happened during the flight.
- We arrived in New Delhi in time at 2:00 hours. We took an hotel shuttle to the Novotel Hotel, our base 3 May camp for two nights. We slept a few hours and at 6:00 we were picked up by CB Singh to go birding. First we went to Chandu, southwest of Delhi. Our first target was already at a road side stop, a Brown Rock Chat. The Chandu area consists of dry and wet fields plus fish ponds and a canal with streaming water. Interesting birds here were White-throated Kingfisher, Indian Pied Myna, Pied Bush Chat, Asian Green Bee-eater, Indian River Tern, Indian Spot-billed Duck, Striated Babbler, Grey Heron, Red-wattled Lapwing, Oriental Pratincole, Grey-headed Swamphen, Red-naped Ibis, Yellow-footed Green Pigeon, Wire-tailed Swallow, Indian Golden Oriole, Black Bittern, Indian Pond Heron, two subspecies of Citrine Wagtail, Pied Kingfisher, Crested Lark, Temminck's Stint, Wood Sandpiper, Grey Francolin and our two main targets, Sind Sparrow and Red Avadavat. We birded there till around 10:00 hours and continued to Sultanpur. There we birded till 13:00 hours. Best birds here were Sarus Crane, Knob-billed Duck, Greater Painted Snipe, Painted Stork, Large Grey and Jungle Babbler, Indian Grey Hornbill, Shikra and Common Hawk-Cuckoo. We could have done more birding in the afternoon, but we were too tired. We returned at the hotel in **Delhi** at 14:00 where we had to deliver our binoculars (not the cameras) at the reception, because our hotel room had a view on the runway. After some discussion with several employees in different hierarchies we had no other option to give it in custody, causing quite some stress for Arjan. Anyhow, we had a good dinner in the restaurant and went to sleep early.
- 4 May We woke up at 4:00 hours to be sure we had plenty of time to get our gear back, but that was returned without any hassle, although I forget my beloved Northface coat in the hotel. We were at 5:00 hours at the New Delhi Airport, where our plane for Guwahati departed in time at 7:20 hours. Our trip to Aranuchal Pradesh will be in another report.






